FULL DESCRIPTION OF TRAINING CONTENTS

Preparation

The course has been created for those charges working inside formative institutions, schools for adults and universities, either jobs involved in processes of project building, in the educational areas. the idea is to

contribute to know history of Rome, the Environment and Culture of that age in Italy.

No pre-preparation requirements, participants will bring with them only documents and a short presentation with topics of their own organization. This is due to share experiences among participants and to compare methodologies and practices. Host organization will share materials through one online platform open to actual participants and previous projects participants in a dedicated social network. Objectives Aims is to know more about the world of Ancient Romans until Renaissance period visiting the major museums in Rome (Galleria Borghese or Musei Capitolini). the ideas is to know more through practice and outdoor activities, experiences and "reflection through action". Every participant will learn history and environment visitingdedicated places (Palatino or Foro Romano) in a kind of outdoor education, looking at Rome today as it was in the past and during Imperial Age.

Methodology

The training program demands full participation from participants. As main method we would let to learn through cooperative work, various outdoor activities, biking, discussions on-site and making movies about the common experience. Lectures will be short and they will take place between outdoor activities. A key objective is: learning by doing and by visiting. All participants should be able to discuss and present simple activities in English language or their thinking inside a work group.

Follow-up

Host organization encourages the exchange of email between learners and teachers, the exchange of material created by themselves or made by teachers, as the use of the website (platform) created by the host organization. We encourage the addiction of presentations as new materials or videos or other learning tools.
